### **Release Programs**

### Definition:

Non-financial release alternatives to pretrial incarceration

# Treatment plans could include some combination of the following:

- regular phone or in-person checkin with case manager
- regular participation in mental health group
- referrals to housing and healthcare resources

### **Diversion Programs**

#### **Definition:**

Community-based alternatives to prosecutions and fines.

# Treatment plans could include some combination of the following:

- community-based court models
- community service projects
- regular participation in mental health group

### Goals:

- appear for all court dates
- abstain from justice involvements
- sustain relationship with community treatment providers

### Goals:

- sustain communication with service providers
- abstain from justice involvements

#### Includes 3 programs:

Own Recognizance (OR) - light-touch monitoring for clients who present fewer needs

# Assertive Case Management (ACM) - more structured and immersive care with more frequent contact with

with more frequent contact with community service providers

#### In-Custody Referral (ICR) -

immediate placement in a community service program upon release, for clients with highest needs

#### Includes 7 programs:

Pretrial Diversion (PTD), Primary Caregiver Diversion (PCD), & Neighborhood Court (NCT) - provide community programs as alternatives to prosecution.

Street Environmental Services (SESP) and Project 20 (P20) - provide street cleaning projects as alternatives to monetary fines.

Weteran's Court (VJC) & Parole
Reentry Court (PRC): alternative court

models focused on treatment, housing

and supportive services
